UT DALLAS PARKING FACTS

- ⇒ On the east side of campus, there are over 2,700 parking spaces in Lots A, B, C, and D. Typically there are 400-500 spaces available at any given time. From the east side of campus, any classroom building is about a 10 minute walk.
- ⇒ Pay-By-Space machines have replaced parking meters on campus, and are available 24 hours a day. Rates are \$1/hour + \$1 swipe fee per use, and accept major credit/debit cards. Pay-By-Space is available in Lots F, G, I, K, and M-West.
- ⇒ Another alternative is a greener, more environmentally friendly option. DART offers FREE parking at the Bush Turnpike Station at Hwy 75/Hwy 190. From there, catch the 883 Comet Cruiser for an 8-10 minute shuttle ride to campus. With 20 bus stops on campus along Rutford Ave, Synergy Park Blvd, Drive A, and Waterview Pkwy, you can get anywhere you need to go. There is no pass required to park at DART or to ride the 883 Buses.
- ⇒ Did You Know? UTD added 1,030 parking spaces on campus over the last 3 years, and plans to add 400 more spaces in 2012, 900+ spaces in 2013, and a total of 2,300+ parking spaces over the next 3 years?
- ⇒ Need a car? Borrow a Zipcar! UT Dallas has partnered with Zipcar to bring self-service, on-demand car sharing to campus. To use a Zipcar, simply register as a member, reserve a car online or by phone, use your Zipcard to enter the car, and drive away. Return the car to the same location where you picked it up. Fast. The CARE Award program began in 1999 and has been awarded to over 130 staff. Any regular employee who is a non-faculty staff member below the level of vice-president, and is employed beyond the probation period,

is eligible as a potential nominee. Nominations may be submitted by staff, faculty, students, and others including University customers. Each awardee is presented with a handsome desk clock, appropriately inscribed, and a framed certificate of recognition as permanent and tangible mementos of their contributions.

To nominate someone you simply fill out a two page form! The information you need to supply are the details you already know about that person (their job, what's above and beyond the call of

duty). Just go to the Staff Council website (www.utdallas.edu/staffcouncil) for more information and to download the file. The award is presented twice a year.

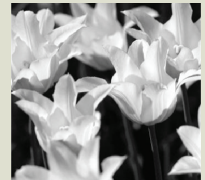
Spring CARE Awards due now!

Automatic External Defibrillator Project (AED's)

The Office of Environmental Health and Safety has initiated the installment of AED's across campus with Phase I completed in August 2011. Key individuals across campus will be trained on the use of the devices.

Phase I:

- ◆ 2 AED's in the police patrol vehicles as well as 2 Oxysure oxygen distribution systems.
- ◆ 2 AED's at the Viceroy Building that houses The Center for Vital Longevity. There is one on each floor that houses UTD's faculty and staff.
- ◆ 2 AED's at the Callier Centers, one at Callier Dallas, the other at the Callier Center on campus.
- ◆ One AED in the Administration Building (AD), on the 2nd floor, near the elevator.
- ◆ One AED was placed on the 2nd floor of the ROC building, near the elevator.

Phase II:

Phase II will be the purchase of 5 AED's and one Oxysure unit. The deployment will be as follows:

- ◆ One AED on the 2nd floor, main lobby area of McDermott Library.
- ◆ One AED at WSTC (location to be determined).
- ◆ One AED in the main dining hall in addition to the Oxysure unit.
- ◆ One AED at SOM

- ◆ One AED at the Student Services Building (SSB)

The estimated completion date of Phase II will be June of 2012.

Phase III:

Phase III will begin with the purchase of 5 additional units. The deployment of these units will be determined after an evaluation of the campus and the areas of most concern. The deployment will be tentatively as follows:

- ◆ One AED in NSERL building
- ◆ One AED in the new ATEC building
- ◆ One will be placed in each on the current Residence halls including RH3 that is under construction at this time.



High Quality CPR: Top Ten Tips

1. Call 9-1-1.
2. Send someone for the Automated External Defibrillator (AED).
3. Immediately begin CPR if an adult victim is unresponsive and not breathing normally.
4. "C-A-B" (Compressions – Airway – Breathing). The AHA emphasizes the importance of early, uninterrupted chest compressions.
5. Untrained rescuers should perform hands-only compressions: "Push hard and fast" on the center of the victim's chest or follow the directions of EMS dispatchers.
6. Trained rescuers should provide 30 compressions and 2 rescue breaths (if they are willing and able) in order to improve outcomes, especially for pediatric victims.
7. Depth: Compress the chest at least 2 inches/5 cm (adults) or 1/3 depth of chest (children and infants).
8. Rate: Provide 100 compressions per minute, to the beat of the Bee Gee's song "Stayin' Alive."
9. Recoil: Allow the chest to recoil fully between compressions.
10. Minimize interruptions: Do not delay or interrupt chest compressions to check pulse or rhythm. When more than one rescuer responds, one rescuer should ready the AED (automated external defibrillator) while the other rescuer performs chest compressions.
